ITEMS TO BRING

VISITORS STAYING OVER ONE OR BOTH NIGHTS

Of course everything mentioned so far applies to you <u>plus</u> the following items.

7] Camping gear will solely be the responsibility of the groups visiting that weekend;

CAMPING GEAR CHECKLIST

- 1. Tent
- 2. Popup, dining fly, tarps any type of cover against the elements.
- 3. Stoves for preparing meals. Propane is preferred but white gas is acceptable if the fuel is stored according to BSA National Policy.
- 4. Cooking gear.
- 5. Fire barrel, patio burner or anything that will contain a fire and must not set on the ground but have a clearance of at least 3" above the ground. You will have to provide your own firewood. You must haul out your ashes.
- 7. Water containers and water bottles. There is potable water on sight by the main parking lot so you won't have to bring water if you prefer not to, but you will need to bring containers.
- 8. Sleeping bags and pads/mattresses.
- 9. A cart[s] or wagon[s] to transport your gear from the main parking lot to the campsite.
- 10. This is a primitive campsite with pit toilets [kybos]. Hand sanitizer and toilet paper will be provided but you may wish to bring your own just in case.
